Extreme adjectives = normal adjective + very

Boiling = **very** hot

Freezing = **very** cold

Tiny = **very** small

We use absolutely with extreme adjectives to make them stronger. We can't use very

Very with normal adjective has the same meaning as an extreme adjective. We can't use absolutely with normal adjectives

This is a normal adjective. It can be made stronger with many adverbs, for example: Very, really, extremely.

This is a weak normal adjective. Quite, rather, a little can be used to make normal adjectives weaker
