

## Suggesting and inviting

### Examples

How about going to the cinema next weekend?

Do you want to take a taxi to the party?

Why don't we buy a new chair for the living room?



Would you like to order a pizza tonight?

### Structure

To make suggestions and invitations, we can use these phrases before different forms of a verb

Do you want to Why don't we Would you like to Let's	+ <b>BASE FORM</b> (order, make, eat)
How about Do you fancy	+ <b>ING FORM</b> (playing, singing)

We can give answers to invitations like this:

	
Sounds great! Sure! Good idea!	I'd rather not I'm afraid I can't Maybe next time
